SYNOPSIS

Berlin's Fuck For Forest is one of the world's most bizarre charities. Based on the idea that sex can save the world, the NGO raises money for their environmental cause by selling home-made erotic films on the internet. Meet Danny, a troubled soul, as he accidentally discovers this exuberant, neo-hippy world where sexual liberation merges with global altruism, and joins their already colourful



operation. From the streets of Berlin to the depths of the Amazon, together they are on a planet-saving mission to buy a piece of forest and save the indigenous peoples from the sick, sick West.

ABOUT FUCK FOR FOREST

The film focuses on a group of four adults (Tommy 32, Leona 28, Natty 22, Danny 23), all from different lands, but sharing the common denominators of a shattered home and a refusal to grow up. Hurt by their past and refusing to conform to the norms of the present, they have cocooned themselves in a fairytale environment with a strange mixture of hedonism and social responsibility. They live by the doctrine of free love in a world dubbed Fuck for Forest. Their time is spent actively roaming whatever public ground they set foot on, indiscriminately handing out flyers to struck passers-by, uttering the words: "Have you heard about Fuck For Forest? It is an ecological project. We collect money to save nature." The reactions of these strangers vary from nervous laughter to accordance upon realizing that they are being asked to participate in porn.

Fuck for Forest is an NGO with a website that charges \$15 a month for access to home-made amateur video and photo material - ranging from soft-core snapshots to hard-core pornography. To this day, the group has raised and donated approximately \$100,000 to struggling tribal cultures in the Amazonian rainforest. The project was initiated by Leona and Tommy, at the time a couple. Her inspiration arose from an innate emotional urge to lend a hand to environmental causes. His motivation was a love of sex and a fascination with indigenous ways. Now with four core members,



the group propagates harmony with nature, free love, body liberation and the use of plants (psychedelic drugs) for spiritual purposes. Having secured a stable income, the group has created a fairytale headquarters where they live a never-land life rid of obligations. Adorned with primitive Amazonian artefacts, sex toys, drug paraphernalia and a vast collection of plants, their apartment makes for a bizarre but picturesque setting.

DIRECTOR'S BIO

Michał Marczak was born in Warsaw in 1982. He started his training in directing at the California Institute of the Arts in Los Angeles, USA before studying philosophy at the University of Warsaw. He later specialised in photography and multimedia studies at the Academy of Fine Arts in Poznań, Poland, and documentary film directing at the Andrzej Wajda Master Film School in Warsaw. In 2011 he directed the Award-winning feature documentary At the Edge of Russia, which gained prizes at international film festivals including HotDocs, Jihlava, Zagreb IFF and



Visions du reel. In the same year he was the recipient of the "Talent Trójki", an award given by the National Polish Radio Channel 3 to the best upcoming film director under 30.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

When I decided to make a film about Fuck for Forest, my first intention was to capture an image of this bizarre phenomenon of our times. It would be a portrayal of ideals becoming de-centered, micro-trends being formed, and elements of our culture going every possible way. The freedom and availability of information has fragmented society and extended the capabilities of human imagination. As I began to examine the characters' organization and understand the complexities of this particular case of foreign aid, I discovered an opportunity to film a paradoxical clash of cultures.

My final intention was to make a film that encompassed a variety of different themes, although this discovery is ultimately left up to the viewer.
