SHORT SYNOPSIS

After 23 years on Death Row a convicted murderer petitions the court asking to be executed. But as he tells his story, it gradually becomes clear that nothing is quite what it seems. THE FEAR OF 13 is a stylistically daring experiment in storytelling, a psychological thriller constructed from a single four-day long interview. In a monologue that is part confessional and part performance, Nick, the sole protagonist, tells a tale with all the twists and turns of classic crime drama. But as the story unfolds it reveals itself as something much deeper, an emotionally powerful meditation on the redemptive power of love and literature. A final shocking twist casts everything in a new light.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Filmmakers are first and foremost, storytellers. As a documentary filmmaker, I have spent my career turning events into narratives, carving from reality a story (a true one, I hope). Over the years I have come to understand a simple but profound truth: we live the events of our lives as experience, but we recall them as stories. And since, in some sense, we are our memories, we are also really the sum of the stories we tell about ourselves, to ourselves and to other people. And that idea is the theme of THE FEAR OF 13.

Formally, it could not be simpler. A man sits in front of the camera and talks - documentary filmmaking boiled down to its essence. But the tale he tells is multi-layered. At its heart is the story of how, through literature, a man comes to master language and to recast the narrative of his own life, to change the story he tells about himself to himself, and so find redemption in the most unlikely of circumstances.

This story about learning how to tell your own story fascinated me from the first, and has kept me enthralled in the many years it has taken us to bring it to the screen. I can't wait to share it!
